


### **Our Vision**

#### PROCLAMATION

## **GRANT APPLICATIONS**

supporting 2023 and 2024 programming



In 2023, we actively pursued funding opportunities through grant applications, submitting a total of 13 grants amounting to \$144,100. Out of these, six grants secured full funding, contributing a total of \$31,000 to support our initiatives. Additionally, three grants received partial funding, totaling \$11,000 out of the requested \$22,100. Unfortunately, one grant application for \$5,000 was not successful. Looking ahead, we anticipate potential support as three grants totaling \$86,000 are pending announcement, with the outcomes expected in 2024.
